Things I Need to Know Before GETT 2018

1. What is GETT?

Girls Exploring Tomorrow's Technology (GETT) is an annual event in the spring for girls in grades 5-10 and their parents to learn more about career opportunities in a broad scope of STEM related industries. The day is filled with exciting, enlightening and experiential workshops lead by successful women in STEM fields. For more information on the background of the program please visit [our website](#).

2. When does registration open?

Registration opens at 8:00am on February 14, 2018. The link to register is <https://2018gett.eventbrite.com/>.

3. What are the ticket types?

There are two ticket types available for the event; "Student" and "Adult".

4. Do I have to register ahead of time?

Yes. This year's GETT event is an open-house style format that allows students/parents/educators to attend during the time period that suits them. However, to make sure that we do not exceed building capacity, and have enough materials prepared, we are requiring pre-event registration.

5. Is there any cost to attend the event?

Due to generous donations from [sponsors](#), we are able offer GETT as a free event to all students. Adults will be charged a fee of \$10 to attend.

6. I would like to bring a bus of students to the event, how do I organize that?

We will then prepare bus packets for you to distribute to your students upon arrival. Special bus instructions will be available after registration.

7. Is there a wait list if the event fills up?

Yes.

8. Where/when is GETT 2018?

GETT 2018 is taking place at [Phoenixville Area Middle School](#), on Saturday, March 17, 2018 from 12:30-5:00pm.

9. Who should attend?

Girls in grades 5-10 are invited to attend. Parents and educators are also encouraged to attend as there will be special parent/educator focused sessions.

10. Who should not attend?

Since the goal of this event is to get girls interested in STEM careers, we ask that families refrain from bringing any younger siblings unless that younger sibling is a girl in grade 5-10.

11. Do I need to bring my ticket?

Upon registering online, you will receive an electronic copy of a ticket sent to your email. Please either print and bring the ticket with you, or be prepared to show the ticket on your mobile phone at the registration table the day of GETT. Having your ticket will expedite the check-in process.

What Can I Expect at GETT 2018?

1. What's new this year?

GETT has adopted an Expo open-house format with an Innovation Zone.

2. Where/when is GETT 2018?

GETT 2018 is taking place at [Phoenixville Area Middle School](#) on Saturday, March 17, 2017 from 12:30-5:00pm.

3. What time should I arrive?

Attendees should plan to arrive between 12:00pm-12:15pm. The program, including the keynote presentation, will begin at 12:30pm in the Auditorium.

4. Where should I park/drop off my daughter?

Parking is available on the school campus. If you are dropping off your daughter(s) or students, please drop off at the Main Entrance of the Middle School.

5. What should I expect when I arrive?

Check-in at the registration tables through the "MAIN Entrance". Proceed to the Auditorium for the start of the program. Attendees will experience the Expo following the Keynote presentation.

6. What will the Expo be like?

The Expo will take place in the main gym, auxiliary gym, and cafeteria. There will be 60+ organizations showcasing hands-on STEM activities, all led by females that work in the industry. Girls and their parents/educators will be able to browse and participate in the Expo from 1:00-4:30pm.

7. Is lunch provided?

No, lunch will not be provided, please eat before you arrive.

8. Can parents drop off their daughter(s) or do they have to stay as well?

Parents can drop off their daughters, however as the waiver on the event registration states: Participation in the Girls Exploring Tomorrow's Technology (GETT) Event is at your own risk. Organizers, speakers, exhibitors, and volunteers cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, injury or other liability resulting in your own student's participation in the GETT Event at Phoenixville Area Middle School on March 17, 2018. Parents/Educators are encouraged to stay if they are able and will be able to explore the Expo with their daughter/student and attend special Parent/Educator break-out sessions.

9. Does my daughter have to attend the entire program?

The event timing is very flexible. If your daughter wishes to see the entire program including the Keynote Speaker and stay until the closing ceremony to receive prizes, please arrive between 12:00pm-12:15pm. The latest time to arrive is 3:30pm.
